Manifest Destiny


1800's US belief, both obvious ("manifest") and certain ("destiny"), that the US was destined to expand westward across North America

Three tenets:

- The assumption of the unique moral virtue of the United States.
- The mission to redeem the world by the spread of republican government and more generally the "American way of life".
- Faith in the US's divinely ordained destiny to succeed in this mission.

- Westward expansion Emigration & Migration
- 1873 North-West Mounted Police
- 1875 Canadian Pacific RR reaches Winnipeg
- 1885 Completion of Transcontinental RR




